INNOLABS Berlin Hackathon 2018 Regulations

The Third European INNOLABS Digital Healthcare Hackathon Event (Berlin Hackathon) is held as a part of the INNOLABS project: “INNOvative LABS for leveraging cross capacity building between ICT, Health, BIO and Medicine sector for new emerging industries in personalized health”. This project has received funding from the European Union’s Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under grant agreement No. 691556.

The Berlin Hackathon will be held in Berlin during the 7th and 8th of May 2018.

Organizer

The Organizer of the Berlin Hackathon is Berlin Partner für Wirtschaft und Technologie GmbH in collaboration with the consortium of INNOLABS project funded by European Union’s Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under grant agreement No. 69556.

Objectives

The objectives of the Berlin Hackathon are to:

- Introduce the INNOLABS project. Explain how it will help innovative entities to disrupt the health markets
- Provide the basis for teams to work on idea creation in a highly stimulating environment
- Encourage and speed up the development of innovative health solutions
- Provide ‘outside the box’ views/approaches on healthcare challenges
- Engage stakeholders and key actors (SMEs, entrepreneurs and start uppers, hospitals, etc)
- Help SMEs to position themselves for the upcoming INNOLABS Open Calls

The mere fact of participating in this contest means that the contestant knows and fully accepts the present rules.

1. Eligibility

The contest is open to small and medium-sized enterprises, startups and individual entrepreneurs, healthcare professionals, developers, designers, patients located in a European or Associated country. This is a requirement to participate.

SMEs can apply with an idea which can be pitched at the Hackathon. Everyone can join a team and take part at the Hackathon. The teams will be composed at the Hackathon.

Teams composition is open but the team leader has to be a SME. Teams must be composed of 3 to 5 individuals and be multidisciplinary. Each Team can only address one of the proposed challenges and should not aim at bringing to the Hackathon already developed solutions.

2. Submission

In order to participate it is to register on the INNOLABS website, and apply to attend the INNOLABS Berlin Hackathon.

Ideas must be submitted via the INNOLABS website <http://www.innolabs.io/>

1. Register on INNOLABS website.
2. You will be asked if you are an SME and if you want to hand in an idea.
 - If you are an SME and you want to hand in an idea: The application consists of a description of the idea and a pitch deck. It must be submitted in PDF file and in English.
A template is provided for the applicants' convenience on INNOLABS Berlin Hackathon website.
 - If you aren't a SME go on with the application. You will be asked from which branch you are.

The deadline for submission of applications is the 23rd of April 2018.

3. Selection Process

A maximum of 25 ideas will be selected and invited to attend and participate in the INNOLABS Berlin Hackathon.

Selected ideas will be announced till the 30th of April 2018 on the INNOLABS website.

5. Awarding Criteria

The team pitches will be evaluated on the basis of the following 4 criteria and rated 0-10 points each.

CRITERIA	SCORES WEIGHTING (0-10)
Innovation of the Idea	(x 1)
Potential Impact	(x 1,5)
Implementation Plan/Traction	(x 1)
Presentation	(x 1)

6. Amount of the Prize

The 3 Berlin Hackathon Winners will be rewarded as follows:

Best team of all challenges	17.500 €
Second best team of all challenges	12.500 €
Third best team of all challenges	6.000 €

7. Jury

The Berlin Hackathon Jury panel will be selected and approved by the INNOLABS Project Management Committee. Jury members will be announced on the INNOLABS website, no later than the 23rd April 2018.

8. Other Considerations

8.1 Documents

Awarded entities/physical persons will be asked to provide in a maximum of 15 days additional documentation about its legal status, bank account and other administrative info.

A requirement before the payment will be to sign a declaration of honour providing a clearance on taxes and social security obligations by the awarded entities/physical persons.

8.2 Intellectual Property Rights

All intellectual property (services, ideas, prototypes, etc) produced during the Berlin Hackathon will remain the property of the creating team. INNOLABS will not acquire any right over the ideas created.

With the understanding that the teams have multiple members and will receive assistance during the event, the organizers expect to hold teams to industry standards regarding collaboration and hereby relente any role in arbitration of ownership upon the completion of the event.

8.3 Confidentiality

Although INNOLABS Consortium will handle all applications and documentation with the maximum confidentiality since the Pitch Contest will be a public event, applicants have to take into account that confidentiality of the idea will not be possible to hold.

8.4 Payment Arrangements

The prize pay-out will be provided by Norway Health Tech, as Project Coordinator of INNOLABS Project.

The settlement of payment awards will be held between Norway Health Tech and the corresponding contestant based on a signed agreement.

Payment will be made in maximum 15 days after the awarded entities/physical persons have been cleared in the administrative aspects (legal existence, documentation) and taxes/social security obligations.

The award will be transferred to a bank account given in the signed agreement, and payed in EUROS.

8.5 Liability

The Organizer shall not be held liable for any damage caused or sustained by any of the participants, including any damage caused to third parties as a consequence of or during the implementation of the activities related to the contest.

8.6 Right to not award the prize

In case any awarded entity does not provide the required documentation in a maximum of 15 days or it is found of IPR infringement during the property check of the idea validation or any other finding that would have resulted in its acknowledge in a different result in the pitching contest, INNOLABS consortium reserves the right to withdraw the recognition and prize to the entity.

INNOLABS consortium also reserves the right to not award any prize in case the quality of all pitches does not meet the Jury minimum marks (20 points).

8.7 Data Protection

INNOLABS partners are committed to protect and respect applicants' privacy. The personal data collected in the context of the present Berlin Hackathon will be processed in accordance with the Data Protection Directive 95/46/EC with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data. Applicants files will be retained in INNOLABS archives until the end of the project activities for which they submitted an application. It is possible to exercise your access, rectify, cancel or opposition rights through the private profile of the entity (delete profile) or by contacting INNOLABS data controller by sending an email to info@innolabs.io.

8.8 Applicable Law

Any matters not covered by this Regulations will be governed by the provisions of the Norwegian Law and the law of the European Union.
