## INNOLABS IDEAS CONTEST 2017 REGULATIONS

The Second European INNOLABS Digital Healthcare Hackathon Event (Oslo Hackathon) is held as a part of the INNOLABS project: “INNOvative LABS for leveraging cross capacity building between ICT, Health, BIO and Medicine sector for new emerging industries in personalized health”. This project has received funding from the European Union’s Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under grant agreement No. 691556.

The Oslo Hackathon will be held in Oslo during the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of September 2017 at Forskningsparken (Oslo Science Park).

### Organizer

The Organizer of the Oslo Hackathon is Oslo Medtech in collaboration with the consortium of INNOLABS project funded by European Union’s Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under grant agreement No. 69556.

### Objectives

The objectives of the Oslo Hackathon are to:

- Introduce INNOLABS project. Explain how it will help innovative entities to disrupt the health markets
- Provide the basis for teams to work on idea creation in a highly stimulating environment
- Encourage and speed up the development of innovative health solutions.
- Provide ‘outside the box’ views/approaches on healthcare challenges
- Engage stakeholders and key actors (SMEs, entrepreneurs and start uppers, hospitals, healthcare centres. Municipalities, etc).
- Help SMEs to position themselves for the upcoming INNOLABS Open Calls.

**The mere fact of participating in this contest means that the contestant knows and fully accepts the present rules.**

## 1. Eligibility

The contest is open to teams of legal entities (Small and medium-sized enterprises or start-ups) as well as individual entrepreneurs established in a European or Associated to Horizon 2020 country. This is a requirement to participate.

Teams composition is open but there must be a team leader (e.g. an entrepreneur). Teams must be composed of 3 to 5 individuals and be multidisciplinary (including individuals with, at least, business and technical profiles relevant to healthcare and, if possible, a link to users relevant to the challenge they are addressing).

Each Team can only address one of the proposed challenges but should not aim at bringing to the Hackathon already developed solutions. The aim is to create disruption and to come up with novel solutions.

## 2. Submission

In order to participate it is necessary to register on the [INNOLABS website](#), and apply to attend the INNOLABS Oslo Hackathon.

Applications must be submitted via the INNOLABS website <http://www.innolabs.io/>

Applications consist of 2 pages (max.) including the reasoning for applying to the selected challenge, and a brief synopsis of the team, its members and their contribution to the team, in pdf and in English.

A template is provided for the applicants' convenience on INNOLABS Oslo Hackathon website.

**The deadline for submission of applications is 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2017.**

## 3. Selection Process

A maximum of 15 teams (5 per challenge) will be selected and invited to attend and participate in the INNOLABS Oslo Hackathon.

The INNOLABS Project Management Committee will choose the best 5 teams per challenge based on 3 criteria rated 0- 10 points each:

CRITERIA	SCORES
Team skills complementarity	(0-10)
Team fit to the challenge	(0-10)
Justification for addressing challenge	(0-10)

**Selected teams will be announced on the 5<sup>th</sup> September 2017 on the INNOLABS website.** They will be also notified by email.

## 5. Awarding Criteria

The team pitches will be evaluated on the basis of the following 4 criteria and rated 0-10 points each.

CRITERIA	SCORE WEIGHTING (0-10)
Innovation of the Idea	(x 1)
Potential Impact	(x 1,5)
Implementation Plan/Traction	(x 1)
Presentation	(x 1)

## 6. Amount of the Prize

The 4 Oslo Hackathon Winners will be rewarded as follows:

<b>Best Team in each challenge (x3)</b>	3 prizes of 10.000,00 EUR each (in words: ten thousand euro)
<b>Best runner up across all 3 challenges</b>	1 prize of 6.000,00 EUR (in words: six thousand euro)

## 7. Jury

The Oslo Hackathon Jury panel will be selected and approved by the INNOLABS Project Management Committee. Jury members will be announced on the [INNOLABS website](#), no later than the 5<sup>th</sup> September 2017.

## 8. Other Considerations

### 8.1 Documents:

Awarded entities/physical persons will be asked to provide in a maximum of 15 days additional documentation about its legal status, bank account and other administrative info.

**A requirement before the payment will be to sign a declaration of honour providing a clearance on taxes and social security obligations by the awarded entities/physical persons.**

### 8.2 Intellectual Property Rights

All intellectual property (services, ideas, prototypes, etc) produced during the Oslo Hackathon will remain the property of the creating team. INNOLABS will not acquire any right over the ideas created.

With the understanding that the teams have multiple members and will receive assistance during the event, the organizers expect to hold teams to industry standards regarding collaboration and hereby relint any role in arbitration of ownership upon the completion of the event.

### **8.3 Confidentiality**

Although INNOLABS Consortium will handle all applications and documentation with the maximum confidentiality since the Pitch Contest will be a public event, applicants have to take into account that confidentiality of the idea will not be possible to hold.

### **8.4 Payment Arrangements**

The prize pay-out will be provided by Oslo MedTech, as organizer of the event and Project Coordinator of INNOLABS Project.

The settlement of payment awards will be held between Oslo MedTech and the corresponding contestant based on a signed agreement.

Payment will be made in maximum 15 days after the awarded entities/physical persons have been cleared in the administrative aspects (legal existence, documentation) and taxes/social security obligations.

The award will be transferred to a bank account given in the signed agreement, and payed in EUROS.

### **8.5 Liability**

The Organizer shall not be held liable for any damage caused or sustained by any of the participants, including any damage caused to third parties as a consequence of or during the implementation of the activities related to the contest.

### **8.6 Right to not award the prize**

In case any awarded entity does not provide the required documentation in a maximum of 15 days or it is found of IPR infringement during the property check of the idea validation or any other finding that would have resulted in its acknowledge in a different result in the pitching contest, INNOLABS consortium reserves the right to withdraw the recognition and prize to the entity.

INNOLABS consortium also reserves the right to not award any prize in case the quality of all pitches does not meet the Jury minimum marks (20 points).

### **8.7 Data Protection**

INNOLABS partners are committed to protect and respect applicants' privacy. The personal data collected in the context of the present EIICE will be processed in accordance with the Data Protection Directive 95/46/EC with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data. Applicants files will be retained in INNOLABS archives until the end of the project activities for which they submitted an application.
